

**SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT UNIT – WORLD BANK
MEDIA MONITORING REPORT VILLAGE LAW**

Period: Apr 6-16, 2017

HEADLINES

- Director General for Fiscal Balance at the Ministry of Finance, Boediarso Teguh Widodo, expected regional transfer could address the issue of underdevelopment. He stated that **the number of underdeveloped regions has decreased from 180 to 122 (in 2014) and 102 (in 2016)**. The government set a target of reducing the number of underdeveloped regions to 42 by 2019.
- Ministry of Finance announced on Apr 13 that it has completed transferring portion of DAK (Special Allocation Fund) and DD (village fund) to 493 regions. As many as 48 regions have not received DAK and DD transfers because they have not satisfied all the requirements. The deadline for these regions to submit requirements were extended to 31 May.
- The amount of DAK that has been transferred was IDR 15.4 trillion (87.5% of total allocation for the first quarter of 2017), while the amount of the DD was IDR 13.2 trillion (36.7% of the total DD Phase 1).
- Indonesia Corruption Watch (ICW) recorded 62 corruption cases at the village government level in 2016, resulting a total loss of IDR 18 billion. Corruption at the village level was lower than that at the district level (219 cases causing IDR 478 billion of loss) and the municipality level (73 cases, with a loss of IDR 247 billion). Majority of the offender (47%) were state officials (National Civil Apparatus or ASN), followed by private firms and village officials.
- Following an establishment of PT Mitra BUMDes Nusantara, affiliated to the State Bureau of Logistics (BULOG), **the government would begin an integration of over 5,000 BUMDes in five provinces in Java into the holding company**. 1. VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT

Director General for Fiscal Balance at the Ministry of Finance, Boediarso Teguh Widodo, expected regional transfer could address the issue of underdevelopment. He stated that the number of underdeveloped regions has decreased from 180 to 122 (in 2014) and 102 (in 2016). The government set a target of reducing the number of underdeveloped regions to 42 by 2019.

The Ministry of Villages commenced co-operation on village development programs with two institutions. With the government of South Australia, the Ministry signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) in the agricultural and farming sectors. The Ministry also began a partnership with the Indonesian National Armed Forces (TNI) in a program targeting villages in transmigration areas. The two institutions would work together in infrastructure and information management. The TNI Commander Gen. Gatot Nurmantyo stated the Ministry would provide trainings on DD oversight to Babinsa (Bintara Pembina Desa, non-commissioned TNI officers posted in the village).

The Minister of Villages stated that villages in three districts - Dompu (NTT), Pandeglang (Banten), and West Halmahera (North Maluku), would receive various supports from the central government to improve maize production. These districts have declared maize farming as priority sector (*prokades*). The Pandeglang district, for instance, prepared 200,000 hectares of land for this purpose.

2. THE DISBURSEMENT AND REPORTING OF DD

Ministry of Finance announced on Apr 13 to that it has completed transferring portion of DAK (Special Allocation Fund) and DD (village fund) to 493 regions. The amount of DAK that has been transferred was IDR 15.4 trillion (87.5% of total allocation for the first quarter of 2017), while the amount of the DD was IDR 13.2 trillion (36.7% of the total DD Phase 1).

The Director General of Fiscal Balance Boediarso Teguh Widodo stated 48 regions have not received DAK and DD transfers because they have not satisfied all the requirements. The deadline for these regions to submit requirements were extended to 31 May.

The media reported that in some district the 2017 ADD has been disbursed to the village. In the Situbondo district (East Java), 110 village (83%) have received the ADD. In the Kubu Raya district (West Kalimantan), ADD has been disbursed in all villages. In the Karo district (North Sumatera) 97% of 259 villages have completed their reports and were ready to receive the ADD. In the North Aceh district (Aceh), disbursement was pending because all 852 villages have not finalized the 2017 village budget plan.

3. VILLAGE GOVERNANCE

From Papua, the media reported that Jayapura regency and Mimika district have taken measures to improve the effectiveness of DD utilization. The Jayapura mayor issued seven decrees on village governance, including on DD utilization, procurement system, and

reporting. The Mimika district government would strictly enforce a prohibition concerning the use of services by third parties in the implementation of DD-funded projects. The government found that last year many DD-funded village infrastructure projects were implemented by private contractors.

Delay in salary payment for village officials reportedly occurred in the East Kutai district (East Kalimantan) and Cilacap district (Central Java). Officials in the East Kutai districts have not been paid since July last year, following a district head decision that the 2016 ADD Phase 2 was not allowed to pay for village officials' salary. Their salary would be budgeted from the 2017 ADD, which was still pending.

In Central Java, the Purbalingga and Batang district governments declared that village officials were no longer authorized to collect *polorogo* fee, from any land transactions in their respective village. Traditionally, *polorogo* was a fee paid by land owner who have sold or rented their land in exchange of services provided by village officials. Government in these districts stated that operational costs of village officials were fully covered by the village budget. Polorogo payment was considered as illegal levies and therefore prohibited.

4. CORRUPTION AND MISUSE

Indonesia Corruption Watch (ICW) recorded 62 corruption cases at the village government level in 2016, resulting a total loss of IDR 18 billion. Corruption at the village level was lower than that at the district level (219 cases causing IDR 478 billion of loss) and the municipality level (73 cases, with a loss of IDR 247 billion). Majority of the offender (47%) were state officials (National Civil Apparatus or ASN), followed by private firms and village officials.

From Aceh, the media reported two cases respectively in the Bireuen district and Subulussalam regency. In the Bireuen, head of the Pulo Ara village stated the denied all

the accusation, arguing that it was politically motivated, in view of the coming village head election. In Subulussalam, 18 villagers of Longkib village signed a petition demanding the district inspectorate office to investigate on an alleged DD misuse in 2015 and 2016.

5. VILLAGE-OWNED ENTERPRISES (BUMDes)

The media reported an ongoing debate on the ownership of BUMDes after a holding company has been set up. Following an establishment of PT Mitra BUMDes Nusantara, affiliated to the State Bureau of Logistics (BULOG), the government would begin an integration of over 5,000 units of BUMDes in five provinces in Java into the holding company. In this pilot project, BUMDes from three to five districts in each province would be selected as participants. In this scheme, PT Mitra BUMDes would become the majority shareholder.

Member of the Nasional House of Representative (DPR) Budiman Sudjatmiko expressed his disagreement with the scheme. He stated that the BUMDes ownership should remain in the hand of village governments. According to the Ministry of Villages data, only 300 BUMDes of a total 18,000 units scored profit.

6. VILAGE HEAD ELECTIONS

In East Java, the Magetan House of Representative (DPRD) proposed that e-voting system is used in village head elections in 23 villages this year. The DPRD would allocate the budget accordingly and discuss further a plan to conduct a pilot projects in selected villages. Meanwhile, in the neighboring district of Magetan, the DPRD proposed that village head election operational costs could be fully covered by the district budget.

Currently, a significant part of the costs become shared responsibilities of the running candidates.

In West Java, simultaneous village head elections would be held in the Garut and West Bandung district in June 2017. Election committees have been established and registration opened. District governments allocated a financial assistance of IDR 10,000 per vote. Village budget (APBDes) could only be used cover implementation costs incurred on the D-day.

7. INDIGENOUS PEOPLE

The South Kalimantan provincial government began the implementation of the Green Revolution social forestry program in 330 hectares of forest located in the Meratus Mountain. Head of the Provincial Forestry Agency Hanif Faisol Nurofiq explained that social forestry would be the only scheme under the Green Revolution program, because *adat* forest (customary forests communally managed by an adat village) do not exist in the province. Separately, environmental NGO WAHLI stated that 33 hectares of the areas designated for social forestry program belong to an adat community residing in the borders of the Hulu Sungai Tengah and Tabalong districts.

From Jakarta, the media reported that bill on Biodiversity Conservation is being discussed. Chairperson of the Adat Land Registration Agency, Kasmita Widodo, stated the bill would reduce the role adat community in forest conservation, as the bill accommodates a greater role of private sector.

8. ADDITIONAL NEWS

- EAST JAVA: In the Waru sub-district of Sidoarjo, villages would allocate fund for domestic waste management's programs to reduce water pollution at the Buntung river. Currently village regulations were being drafted, stipulating that the program would be funded by village budget (APBDes) ([Wajib Ada Anggaran Kebersihan Desa](#) – Jawa Pos, April 12, 2017).
- BALI: the media reported that some villages have displayed banners on several locations in villages of the Bangli district. The banner contains information on the recently issued 2017 village budget plan ([Transparansi Pengelolaan APBDes, Sejumlah Desa Pasang Balibo](#) – Balipost.co.id, April 10, 2017).
- CENTRAL JAVA: Regional Agency for Disaster Management Baden (BPBD) in the Banjarnegara district would implement disaster-resilience village (*destana*) program in four disaster-prone villages: Kalibombong, Pasegeran, Beji, and Kayuares. As the first step, the BPBD organized disaster preparedness training for 35 volunteers from these villages (BPBD [Banjarnegara Rencana Bentuk Empat Destana Tahun ini](#) – Suaramerdeka.com, April 16, 2017).
- CENTRAL JAVA: In the Cilacap district, only 45 of 269 village has BUMDes, per February 2017 ([Banyak Potensi, Desa Didorong Bentuk Badan Usaha](#) – Suaramerdeka.com, April 8, 2017).
